Mr. Lee has been practicing law since 1998 and currently is a partner in the Global Insurance Services Practice Group in the Chicago office of Goldberg Segalla. His practice concentrates on commercial litigation, particularly complex insurance coverage litigation within an environmental context.

With an extensive background in environmental science and nearly 20 years of experience as a trial and appellate civil litigator, John has successfully defended clients in matters as diverse as multi- party coverage disputes, million-dollar environmental site remediation, PCB, asbestos, and lead exposure claims, alleged construction negligence, and premises and professional liability.
